Birdspotting

We are delighted to see **Dippers** enjoying the burn. Despite their being at 'moderate risk of extinction', we often spot these small birds fishing for stonefly and caddis fly larvae.

Dippers have a third, transparent eyelid that they can close, enabling them to see underwater.



Other regular visitors include **Heron**s, and a group of **Redwings** which were too quick for local bird lover Barbara to snap!

We'd especially love to meet anyone who can help organise **Tea in the Park**, our annual family fun day, dog show and duck race in late summer.





We chose trees which were significant to the history of the park, easily accessible, and not an issue for grass mowing. The trail will form a circular walk running along most of the length of the park, taking the walker on both sides of the burn.

As well as a simple map and on-tree plaques, we use What3words to record each tree's location. Once this project is complete, you'll find all this information on the park's notice boards and our website.

Tree trail progress

How many trees can you identify? With such a variety of beautiful trees, we hit upon the idea of a Tree Trail: an enriched and educational walk around the park.

Thirteen trees will feature in our tree trail: **Aspen, Cherry, Hornbeam, Wheatley Elm, Rowan, Swamp Cypress, Maple, Horse Chestnut, two types of Willow, Birch, Pine and Oak.**

These trees will be identified with a plaque, similar in style to the park's memorial plaques.

Edinburgh Council is very enthusiastic and supportive of this proposal. We are currently discussing plaque and post suppliers, and their subsequent installation.

We hope this work will be completed in spring 2026 so that the tree trail can soon be enjoyed by as many people as possible.

The Council's Peter Davidson and the wonderful parks team not only mended this bridge. They also did a full repair on the Hornbeam Bridge by the theatre which also had rotten beams. Wonderful job!
