Braidburn Valley Park Cherry Tree Benches

The cherry trees in the Park are now over seventy years old and in decline. A replacement programme began in 2008 which will last up to twenty years. To celebrate the Centenary of Girl Guiding in 2010, a hundred new trees were planted in 2010. Some eighty trees were felled in 2009. Many had rot in their trunks but around twenty larger logs in good condition were saved.

These logs were converted into benches for the Park using a Community Grant from the South Central Neighbourhood Partnership. The benches were made by Julian Angus in his workshop at Cousland in Midlothian to a very high standard and finish. Each has the date of 1935 carved into a leg as a connection to the planting date of the trees from which the timber came.

The Friends Group decided to place the benches within the original cherry tree trefoil. One was installed below the ramped access off Comiston Road and two on the path to the east of the burn. The wood will darken and weather with time but the benches will be treated annually with teak oil to prolong their life of around ten years. We hope the hundreds of daily users of

the Park will appreciate them as places to rest and enjoy the views. Recyling the logs maintains a Park connection with the original trees planted in 1935 by the Girl Guides and avoids sending the chipped logs to landfill.



Keep That Green Flag Flying

Enthusiastic Friends, Committee members, QII members and Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme volunteers have been busy over recent months on a variety of tasks in the Park. Good progress was made on each of the 'Work Party' evenings. If you have an hour for gentle exercise, fresh air and great company look out for notices in 2011.

Dead rowan trees have been removed from the areas originally planted by the Council. Broken and fallen branches have been lifted from paths and quick acting local residents have acquired some firewood! The battle against invasive Japanese Butterbur continues by the bridge beneath the Pavilion. It is impossible to remove all the roots and so follow up work is needed in 2011 but native species, especially grass, may now re-establish.

Turf encroaching on the path with lights that crosses the Park has been cut back to reveal all the tarmac which has made parts of the path significantly wider. This job falls in the 'painting the Forth Bridge' category and could last for ever! Similarly, we have regularly painted out graffiti on the gas governor and the electricity sub station. Finally a number of bat boxes made by the Cubs have been fixed to trees at the southern end of the Park.

The list of potential jobs is endless but many Park users have commented on how fine the Park looks, in part thanks to the volunteers. And how the Park is used! As a member told us, "We've had all three grandchildren in the Valley this week in some of the worst weather we've had in a long while - and they (and we) had a grand time regardless!" Long may such pleasure continue.
