

Wildflower Meadow Project Gets Underway

If you have been walking at the south end of the park recently, on the slope down from the Friends of Braidburn Valley Park interpretation panel, you may have noticed three large kidney-shaped areas of ground that have had the turf removed. This is the start of the wildflower meadow project that was previously reported in the Valley Voice.

The Friends have been successful in attracting money from the Scottish Executive and City of Edinburgh Council to work with the Scottish Wildlife Trust to create a wildflower meadow to promote locally important wildflower species. The beds will be sown in the spring with a mixture of colourful species such as Red Champion, Poppies and Cowslips. It is hoped that children from schools at both ends of the park will help with this project.

The three beds look bleak at the moment, but come the summer and into next year, we should see a fantastic array of wildflowers, which in turn will attract more insects and birds back into the park.
